Students and parents share the responsibility to care for the mobile device issued by the Sweetwater Union High School District. Warranty coverage is limited.

The receipt of a mobile device will meet the Williams Legislation for some courses as listed below. This legislation states that every school in the district is required to provide "Sufficient" instructional materials for all students in the core subject areas of mathematics, English/language arts, history/social science and science (plus health and world languages). Each pupil including English learners must have textbooks or instructional materials, to use in class and at home.

Sweetwater Union High School District programs and activities shall be free from discrimination based on gender, sex, race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, ethnic group identification, marital or parental status, physical or mental disability, sexual orientation or the perception of one or more of such characteristics. SUHSD Board Policy 0410.

Damage, Loss, Theft

Parent/Student Financial Responsibility for Repairs

Students/Parents are responsible for the repair cost for any instances of breakage or damage to the mobile device.

Students will be issued textbooks to assist with school work until his/her mobile device is repaired and returned. Students are encouraged to take VERY good care of their device.

Lost Mobile Device

Anytime a mobile device goes missing, it must be reported to the school immediately. The faster it gets reported, the sooner we can start working on looking for it.

The District has a clear policy *BP 6161.2* (below) regarding who is responsible for lost or damaged District property on loan to students. Based on that policy, parents/students are responsible for loss or damage to a mobile device. The cost of reparation is equal to the current replacement cost of the mobile device or accessory.

Stolen Devices

In the event a mobile device is stolen, a police report must be filed immediately. Since devices are school property, parents do not have to file the police report, the school will. However, parents and students will be asked to meet with law enforcement and school officials to help complete the report.

Parents and students are responsible for replacement costs of stolen property if the student is negligent and/or contributes to the device being stolen. Negligence is anything the student does that violates the High School Mobile Device Acceptable Use Policy which results in theft or loss. For example, a student who loans his/her device to a friend who leaves the device in an unsecured location, resulting in theft, would be negligent under the High School Mobile Device Acceptable Use Policy since it clearly states that students are not to loan their devices to anyone - this includes family members.

Replacement Costs are as follows:

Total cost for the mobile device Lenovo Yoga 11e and all accessories is - \$451.50.

Parents may pay for lost equipment in one of the following ways:

- pay in full at time of loss
- payment plan (to be determined at school where mobile device was reported lost)

Parents who do not want to assume this liability or who worry about whether their child is responsible enough to care for a mobile device as a take-home item may opt to have a student check out and return a mobile device from school daily. Students on daily checkout are still responsible for loss or damage to the mobile device while it is checked out to them. However, the concern about potential damage or loss to the device while the student is not at school is removed.

If a lost mobile device is found in good working condition, parents will be reimbursed for any amount of money they have paid to replace the lost item. If the device is found but is not in good working condition, parents will be charged for the total cost of repair.

High School Student Mobile Device
Acceptable Usage Policies
READ CAREFULLY

1. The mobile device, an educational tool, is the property of the Sweetwater Union High School District. It may be confiscated and inspected at any time. The student should have NO expectation of privacy of any materials found on a mobile device.
2. Sweetwater Union High School District mobile devices are provided as an educational tool for school work. While mobile devices may be used for personal purposes, it is first and foremost for use with school-related activities and assignments.
3. Sweetwater Union High School District encourages students to take their mobile device home daily for class work and to recharge the device daily. **All mobile device rules and regulations apply at all times, both during the school day and at home.**
4. Students **must** bring a fully charged device to school every day. Failure to bring a device or any other class material(s) does not release the student from their responsibility for class work.
5. If a student repeatedly fails to bring materials to class, including a mobile device, the student will be subject to classroom/school consequences.
6. Sweetwater Union High School District makes no guarantee, written or implied, that materials on the device, including student work, will be safe from deletion or corruption, accidental or otherwise. It is good practice to back up, duplicate, e-mail, or archive files to Google Drive or OneDrive. **All students have a Google Drive and Office 365 account** with substantial storage space.
7. The mobile device comes equipped with a front facing camera and video capacities. Student must request permission before recording an individual or group. Recording must be used appropriately in an educational manner. Sweetwater Union High School District reserves all rights concerning any recording and/or publishing of any student or staff member's work or image. Students must obtain school permission to publish a photograph or video of any school related activity.
8. Devices must remain free of any writing, drawing, stickers, or labels that are not property of the Sweetwater Union High School District. District affixed labels and tags shall not be removed from devices.
9. Inappropriate or provocative images/text including but not limited to: pornography, guns, weapons, inappropriate language, threatening language, drug, alcohol, or gang symbols are not permitted and subject to classroom/school consequences.
10. All students should recognize and guard their personal and private information. While on the Internet, students shall not reveal personal information, including a home address or phone number, or the address or phone numbers of other students.
11. All students should protect their personal usernames and passwords. Students who believe a username or password has been hacked or otherwise stolen should report the concern to school administration immediately.
12. Any student who uses another student's or adult's username or password is subject to being charged with identify theft. The District has the ability to track IP addresses used by students and will work with law enforcement to ensure violations of privacy laws are met with the appropriate legal response.

High School Mobile Device ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY

Statement of Responsibility

The use of the mobile device is a privilege. The user is responsible for what he/she says and does on his/her school assigned device. Network administrators will make reasonable efforts to maintain reliable service. They cannot, however, absolutely guarantee that the system will always be available or operating correctly.

Student should know that **none** of their data is private or confidential. Any communication or data may be subject to review by network or school administration.

Parent/Guardian Responsibilities

Talk to your student about values and the standards that your student should follow on the use of the Internet just as you would on the use of all media information sources such as television, telephones, movies, and radio.

Take extra steps to protect your child. Encourage your child to use and store the mobile device in an open area of your home, such as the kitchen or family room, so you can monitor what your child is doing online. Use the Internet with your child to help enforce safe browsing habits. Children often model adult behavior.

Go where your child goes online. Monitor the places that your child visits. Let your child know that you're there, and help teach her/him how to act as s/he works and socializes online.

Review your child's friends list. You may want to limit your child's online "friends" to people your child actually knows and is working with in real life.

Understand sites' privacy policies. Internet sites should spell out your rights to review and delete your child's information.

Limit the time your student is on the mobile device. While it is a very engaging device, it is a school work device. Care and constant monitoring will reduce your child's exposure to excessive use. Students should not have access to a mobile device after 10 PM.

Report unwelcome or malicious online threats. Report in a timely fashion to the school any online interactions that can be considered threatening.

Help your child develop a routine. Many parents have found success by helping create a routine for their child's computer use. Define a routine as to how the device is cared for and when and where its use is appropriate.

Take a look at the apps or programs. It is to the advantage of the students, parents, and school that the parents have a working understanding of the programs and student work found on the mobile device.

Read and share with your child the SUHSD care and use policies. By reading and discussing the care and use policies, you can create a clear set of expectations and limitations for your child.

Please explain to your child that his/her mobile device may be selected at random to provide their device for inspection. Your child should have NO expectation of privacy of any materials found on a mobile device.

Remind your child to bring his/her device to school daily. If your child leaves his/her device at home, he/she is responsible for getting the course work completed as if he/she had a device present.

School Responsibilities

- Provide Canvas LMS, Internet and Email accounts and access to all students.
- Provide Internet filtering/blocking of inappropriate materials while at school.
- Provide “cloud” storage via Google Drive and OneDrive. Sweetwater Union High School District reserves the right to review, monitor, and restrict information stored on or transmitted via SUHSD owned equipment and to investigate inappropriate use of resources.
- Provide staff guidance to aid students in doing research and help assure student compliance of the Acceptable Use Policy.
- Provide access to digital citizenship curricula via Canvas LMS.

Student Responsibilities

- Using mobile/digital devices in a responsible and ethical manner.
- Obeying general school rules concerning behavior and communication that apply to network use and according to the SUHSD Acceptable Use Policy.
- Using all technology resources in an appropriate manner so as to not damage school equipment. This “damage” includes, but is not limited to, the loss of data resulting from delays, non-deliveries, miss- deliveries or service interruptions caused by the students’ own negligence, errors or omissions. Use of any information obtained via SUHSD’s designated Internet System is at your own risk. SUHSD specifically denies any responsibility for the accuracy or quality of information obtained through its services.
- Helping SUHSD protect our computer system/mobile device by contacting an administrator about any security problems they may encounter.
- Monitoring activity on their account(s).
- If a student should receive email or other electronic message containing inappropriate, threatening or abusive language or if the subject matter is questionable, he/she is asked to contact a school administrator.
- Returning their mobile device to the school Library/Media Center at the end of each school year. Students who move schools, are expelled or terminate enrollment at Sweetwater Union High School District must return their individual school mobile device on the last day of attendance.

Student Activities Strictly Prohibited

- Illegal installation or transmission of copyrighted materials
- Any action that violates existing SUHSD Board Policy, or public law
- Sending, accessing, uploading, downloading, or distributing offensive, profane, threatening, pornographic, obscene, or sexually explicit materials
- Use of sites to sell or buy term papers, book reports and other forms of student work
- Messaging services and chat rooms (i.e.: MSN Messenger, ICQ, etc.) without prior staff permission
- Internet/computer games with inappropriate content (i.e. extreme violence)
- Changing of mobile settings (exceptions include personal settings such as font size, brightness, etc.)
- Downloading non-school inappropriate Apps
- Spamming or sending mass or inappropriate emails
- Gaining access to other student’s accounts, files, and/or data

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- Use of the school's Intranet/E-mail accounts for financial or commercial gain or for any illegal activity
- Use of anonymous and/or false communications through web services such as MSN Messenger, Yahoo Messenger, Facebook, etc.
- Participation in credit card fraud, electronic forgery or other forms of illegal behavior
- Vandalism (any malicious attempt to harm or destroy hardware, software or data) of school equipment will not be allowed
- Transmission or accessing materials that are obscene, offensive, threatening or otherwise intended to harass or demean recipients
- Bypassing the Sweetwater Union High School District's web filter through a web proxy or Virtual Private Network (VPN)
- Other activities deemed inappropriate by SUHSD

Student Mobile Device Care

- Mobile Device batteries must be charged and ready for school each day.
- Students will be held responsible for maintaining their individual mobile and keeping them in good working order.
- Only labels or stickers approved by Sweetwater Union High School District may be applied to the device.
- Devices that malfunction or are damaged must be reported to the Library/Media Center. SUHSD Information Technology Services will be responsible for repairing devices that malfunction. Devices that have been damaged from student misuse, neglect or are accidentally damaged will be repaired with cost being borne by the student. Students will be responsible for the entire cost of repairs to the device that are damaged intentionally.
- Students are responsible for any and all damage.
- Devices that are stolen must be reported immediately to the school.

Following the Law

- Comply with trademark and copyright laws and all license agreements. Ignorance of the law is not immunity. If you are unsure, ask a teacher or parent.
- Use or possession of hacking software is strictly prohibited and violators will be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with all applicable District, state, federal laws. Violation of applicable state or federal law will result in criminal prosecution or disciplinary action by the District.

Student Discipline

The discipline procedure in the SUHSD Student Handbook addresses serious and major offenses such as stealing and destruction of school or personal property; cell phone user policy; possession of improper images on any electronic device; or any other violation of the school discipline policy will apply to the mobile device. Depending on the seriousness of the offense students may lose mobile device and/or network privileges as well as being held for detention, suspension or even in extreme cases expulsion.

Instruction

DAMAGED OR LOST INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS

The Board of Trustees recognizes that instructional materials are an expensive resource and that each student is entitled to sufficient instructional materials in accordance with law. Instructional materials provided for use by students remain the property of the District. Students are responsible for returning borrowed materials in good condition, with no more wear and tear than usually results from normal use.

When materials are lost or so damaged that they are no longer usable, the student shall be immediately issued a replacement material. However, students or parents/guardians shall be responsible for reparation equal to the current replacement cost of the materials. When materials are damaged but still usable, the Superintendent or his/her designee shall determine an appropriate charge.

If it can be demonstrated to the Superintendent or his/her designee's satisfaction that the student has taken all reasonable precautions to safeguard instructional materials issued to him/her, the Superintendent or his/her designee may excuse the student or parent/guardian from payment or reparation.

If reparation is not excused and not paid by the student or parent/guardian, the District may withhold the student's grades, diploma and transcripts in accordance with la, Board policy, and administrative regulation.
