The Sweetwater Union High School District has partnered with the Chula Vista Police Department to bring specially trained dogs onto our school campus to deter contraband substances from being brought onto our site. This resource is one way to ensure a safe learning environment on campus and deter students from bringing illegal substances to school.

DOGS ARE TRAINED TO DETECT THE ODOR OF THE FOLLOWING SUBSTANCES:

- ILLICIT DRUG ODORS : marijuana, cocaine, methamphetamine, heroin, and opium
- ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: wine, beer, whiskey, etc.
- **<u>RESIDUAL ODOR</u>**: any one of the above previously present
- **EXPLOSIVES**: ammunition, pyrotechnics, weapons

The dog being used is friendly and non- aggressive, but we ask that students preclude from trying to pet the dog. During random campus visits, the dogs will sniff the air around classrooms, student belongings, storage areas, restrooms and cars parked on school grounds for potential contraband items. When a classroom is checked, students will be asked to leave the room while leaving their belongings behind. With an administrator or teacher present, the canine team will sniff the interior of the room including the air around student belongings. This includes backpacks, purses etc.

Students will be notified by PA or TV announcements of this service. However, there will be no announcement during the actual date of the visit by the dog(s).
